



What is the Sports Premium?

The PE and Sports Premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. Schools have to spend the grant on enhancing, rather than maintaining, existing provision. They have the freedom to choose how they do this. Improvements must be sustainable in the long term.

We will receive £17, 610 during 2017 - 2018.

In addition to the Sports Premium the school makes additional contributions to supporting the delivery of PE throughout the school including the commissioning of coaches to support core PE and the swimming programme in Year 3.

We currently hold the Sainsbury's Silver Award and are working towards the gold award.

Healthy living through the promotion of heathy school meals and sports for all during playtimes has been an emphasis for the Academy during 2016/17. We improved our playground environment as well as having dedicated staff to encourage games of all types at playtime/lunchtime, we will continue with this focus.

We have established football teams, a rugby team, cricket teams, indoor athletics, basketball, netball and an athletics squad and will continue to build on these.

Island Links – one of our school governors holds the position of Vice Chair of Island Football Primary Schools and Treasurer of the Island Schools Cricket Association. Our health and well-being lead is the club captain of the Isle of Wight Rugby Club and maintains strong links there.

Our sports crew was established during 2014/15 - Having established a set of 8 sports leaders across KS2 that help deliver lessons and help organise sports games for their class this is continuing this year with a new set of KS2 children

During 2017/18 we will be working with one of our sister schools, St Francis, to develop and embed a new programme of study for PE. This new approach is intended to improve the planning, assessment process and consistency of PE delivery across the two academies.

We intend that the impact of this funding ensures that our children

- will receive high quality PE teaching
- develop a lifelong interest in sport irrespective of their ability
- · extend their skills within PE
- are supported by up-skilled class teachers providing more aspirational PE on a weekly basis
- extend their engagement and enjoyment of PE
- have greater access to multi-school events, competitive and non competitive
- · experience a wider range of sporting activities
